### ↳ **Module 6 - Commentary driving**

Participants are assessed during commentary driving training exercises to check and consolidate the modules learnt previously in the theory sessions.

### ↳ **Assessment**

At the end of the two different types of sessions (theory and practical), the drivers will undergo a full assessment of their skills. The theoretical assessment will take the form of a multiple-choice test which must be passed before the participant can take the practical assessment. The practical assessment will consist of the continuous assessment that takes place during the course, and of a practical test of the qualifications.

Drivers must successfully complete both assessments to be considered proficient, and will then receive a certificate of proficiency
